- Check out ancient Aboriginal rock art sites including the Bunjil rock art shelter and Manja shelter.
- Put nocturnal fauna under the spotlight on a night walk. Several trails around Halls Gap have bats, possums and more.
- The Brambuk Cultural Centre is a great place to tap into Aboriginal culture. Kids can even learn to throw a boomerang!
